We are ready for Term 2!

We are excited that we can 'Welcome Back' more than just our students now that our Covid guidelines have been eased...thank goodness! As of this term we are allowed to invite up to 200 visitors to outdoor events without the restrictions of a Covid Safety Plan. Since we have 220 students it would have been ideal if the number was a little higher, but we will thankfully take what is offered! Parents are able to briefly enter the school grounds to pick up or drop off students without signing in, however, if you are staying on site for longer then we are still required to keep a record of visitors. This is through the sign on book in the office and by using the QR code. Early pick-ups during the day will still be through the office so students can be signed out.

However, this has remained unchanged:

Students and staff with flu-like symptoms need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result and be symptom-free before being permitted to return to school.

Students who do not undertake a COVID-19 test will not be permitted to return to school for a 10-day period. Additionally, they must be symptom-free for at least 3 days prior to returning to school



ILLAWARRA SPORTS HIGH SCHOOL



A wonderful first term was had with the Year 3 Figtree Heights ethics students.

We discussed the notion of greed and things to consider when deciding if someone is being greedy and when/if being greedy is wrong. The students thought about different scenarios to critically examine situations where being a bit greedy may even be understandable and weighing up things such as willingness to share, wasting food or the earth's resources in deciding if being greedy wrong. What if the person is too young to understand that they are greedy? Can you be greedy and not even know it?

Opinions were formed and reasons provided as the children took turns and respectfully listened to each other.

The reality, though, is that SRE and Ethics rely on volunteers and many children are missing out.

Currently there is a considerable number of children signed up to do ethics so there is clearly a demand.

Please consider applying if you are free on a Wednesday afternoon. Even doing it for one year would make a big difference in keeping the programme alive at this school.

It involves an initial application on line, an interview, WWC check and criminal history check. The training is fun! Two days at the UOW with like- minded people. There should be another training session coming up in May. You will be surprised how rewarding and fulfilling it will be for you personally.

You do not have to have ANY teaching experience or a degree in philosophy. You will be fully trained in delivering a carefully formulated, Department of Education approved 'script' and facilitating a discussion. A little pre-reading before the lesson and a half hour on Wednesday afternoon between 12 and 12.30 is all that is required once you are trained.

You will also be thoroughly trained in behaviour management. The children at Figtree Heights, however, are thoughtful and lovely to work with, though be assured that a teacher is in the classroom with you, should you need support.

Teaching ethics is a very rewarding experience and after you go home you will find yourself smiling and thinking back on the lesson and the children's insightful responses.
