## A few hints:

• Think 'sizzling starts' to begin your speech. Try to avoid "My name is ... and I am going to talk to you about...."

• Try to avoid including lots of facts, statistics and lists. Include personal opinions and tell information in YOUR OWN WORDS (If you can't pronounce a word – use an easier one).

• Use palm cards and try to put main points of the speech on the cards rather than writing out the whole speech. If you have any questions please ask your class teacher.
